SCHEDULE 1 New Arrivals (Refugee clients only)

Schedule 1 is designed to meet the specific needs of our newly arrived refugee clients. The New Arrivals ESOL Program offers free classes and workshops to adults living in Summit County over the age of 18 who are not enrolled in a public school system. Our classes will help individuals with becoming self-sufficient and workplace ready by improving their reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills.

Students who register for schedule 1 will attend 4 hours of weekly ESOL Life Skills/Civics classes and 8 hours of New Arrival ESOL courses.

In addition, students can attend free workshops throughout the session.

Monday – Thursday from 11:30-1:30

SCHEDULE 2 ESOL Life Skill and Civics (\$65.00 includes text book and supplies)

Schedule 2 is designed for students who want to improve their English proficiency and become more active members of the Akron area. Our classes will introduce students to life skill and civics topics through reading, writing, listening, and speaking activities.

Students who register for schedule 2 will attend 4 hours of weekly ESOL Life Skills/Civics classes.

In addition, students can attend free workshops throughout the session.
